

## **Master of Oriental Medicine Program**

All credits counting toward the Master of Oriental Medicine Program must be earned within eight (8) calendar years from the date of enrollment. Credits for the Master of Oriental Medicine Program are earned and applied at the time of class completion per the designated schedule. Part-time students may be required to complete additional courses that were not part of the original curriculum due to program or professional changes. The following list outlines the requirements that must be successfully completed prior to graduation:

- Completed enrollment documentation, including but not limited to health verification forms, physician statement of health, enrollment agreement(s), curriculum vitae and notarized copies of licenses or certificates
- Satisfactory completion of all course work with a minimum grade of 70% in each course
- Overall G.P.A. of 3.0
- Completion of 15 hours of community service per semester or volunteer work in various areas of the College
- Clinic competency exam passed with a score of 80% or better
- Satisfactory completion of the Terminal Competency course
  - Exit and competency exams passed with a score of 80% or better, and competency assessment completed satisfactorily
- Payment of all tuition, fees and other financial obligations to KCCM must be complete and all KCCM equipment/library materials must be returned or paid for
- Master of Oriental Medicine Students must have on record, as part of the student's admissions file, official transcripts from an accredited college or university showing completion of the co-requisite 60 credit hours including the following:
  - 3 credits—Biology with a grade of C or better
  - 3 credits—Psychology with a grade of C or better
  - 3 credits—Chemistry or Physics with a grade of C or better



Graduation requirements may change over time in response to new national accreditation standards and other factors. Part-time Oriental Medicine students, who do not meet graduation requirements in the specified eight year period, are required to meet the graduation requirements in effect three years prior to their date of graduation, rather than those in effect at the time they began the program.
